


# The Burn Support Group Summer Newsletter

Burn Support Group wishes to express their gratitude to all those that purchased tickets, and thank you for your patience as the raffle drawing date was extended.





### **Emma's Helpful Hints**

Our Fire and Emergency team are always on call 24/7 365 days a year – including Christmas - although as wonderful as your holiday celebrations probably are, we would rather not be invited! Below are some tips to keep you and your family fire safe over Christmas and throughout the summer.

**Kitchens** - We all know Christmas is a busy time of year, especially in the kitchen and we all know how easy it is to get distracted between kids running around, family turning up, pets etc. so it's even more important than usual to follow the golden rule of "Keep looking when you are cooking"

**BBQS** - There is nothing more kiwi than a BBQ on Christmas day but just make sure your BBQ, whether gas or charcoal, is in good working order before the big day (and that means more than just checking the gas bottle is full!):

- Regularly check and maintain fittings and connections
- Use your BBQ on a solid surface away from anything combustible
- Supervise children around the BBQ and make sure all matches and lighters are kept up high away from Children.
- After using the BBQ make sure the cylinder is turned off (Gas BBQs) and that you cool any hot coals completely before disposing.
