## HOW HOT IS YOUR HOT WATER?

According to Safekids Aotearoa, every day a child is burned severely enough to be admitted into hospital. Of 1 to 2 year olds admitted to hospital due to severe burns, over half are caused by spilt hot drinks and other liquids.

Use the thermometer below to check the temperature of your water.

A reminder from the brochure:

Hot water coming out of a tap should be between 50 and 55 degrees celsius

Always supervise young children when having a bath, shower or washing their hands

Run cold water into a bath before you run the hot water

"Seconds to burn, BUT at least 20 minutes to coo!!!"



A huge congratulations to Ocean Johnson, Brayden Warnock-Hannon, Melissa Paterson, World Al-Tiay and Pete Sharp, who will be representing Burn Support Group in Dallas.

Ocean is a regular attendee at our Children's Camp. This year she received the Outstanding Camper award. Ocean receiving third degree burns to her legs when she was 14. She is "looking forward to meeting other burn survivors from around the world and hear their stories as well as sharing mine"

Pete is a current board member and the Father of a Burn Survivor. Pete attends our Childrens Camp and utilises his outdoor skills. Pete's family is actively involved with the burns community as they recover physically and mentally of the emotional trauma burns has on the parents and the family.

Worod (or Ru is she commonly known as) has been a counsellor at our children's camp. She became a burn survivor at the age of 11 and believes this opportunity will give her a chance to grow both individually and in turn have the chance to bring back what I have gained and shape both the burn survivor community as well as general society.

Brayden has attended our camp for seven years after being burnt at the age of 5. He feels like "I would be able to learn a lot about how to teach people to look after their own scars better"

Melissa is a board member, camp volunteer and a burn survivor.

Melissa says "I feel incredibly honoured to be part of the contingent travelling to the WBC this year. I hope to use this as an opportunity to grow more and meet other amazing people. I am also excited to share this experience with others on the same journey. I have seen other survivors and family members return and I am also blown away by how much the congress changes them. I can't wait!!!

Phoenix World Burn Congress is an annual, international conference that brings together burn survivors, their families, caregivers, burn care professionals, and firefighters. People come together to offer support, increase their knowledge of burn recovery, and share inspiring stories. For many burn survivors, it is their first opportunity to connect with others on the journey of burn recovery. Through workshops, speakers, and peer-topeer dialogue, people come to better understand the issues that impact the lives of burn survivors.

Next years World Burn Congress 2018 is in Grand Rapids, Michigan, USA. It will run from September 12 - 15, 2018.


